

Plant Belles at the National Trust

Flower Power Plant Belles are now supporting plants in two National Trust gardens of Devon

This year sees the introduction of Plant Belles to the National trust gardens at Castle Drogo and Knightshayes Court.

Castle Drogo, nr Drewsteignton, overlooking the Teign valley and Dartmoor, have introduced 70 Plant Belles and stem supports, which comfortably adorn the beautifully established formal Arts & Crafts garden, designed by Edwin Lutyens and George Dillistone back in the early 20th century.

Flower Power Garden Design have designed a new grand Plant Belle, in collaboration with the Head Gardener, Andrew Midgley. 'George' the new Plant Belle, named after George Dillistone, has been created especially to support large established border planting. We shall see how they help to protect the perennial borders in the 'windy' grand formal garden at Castle Drogo.



John Lanyon, Head Gardener at Knightshayes Court gardens, nr Tiverton, Devon, has commissioned the Plant Belle designers to create 'wigwams' for the recently renovated walled kitchen gardens. Over 20 large wigwam structures have been handmade and dressed in time to supporting this years fragrant Sweet Pea collections at Knightshayes.

Both gardens are talking of more Plant Belle supports in the future. Meanwhile Flower Power Garden design are taking the Plant Belles public, at the RHS Malvern Spring Gardening Show, in May 2009. You too will be able to create a little of the grand and elegant in your garden.
